# INTERVIEW MICHAEL

0. Please tell the readers, who don't know you, a bit about yourself (off and on cardistry).

I am 17 years old and live in Saint Louis, Missouri. The first cardist I saw was Nikolaj Pedersen doing "Promelo", when I was about 13 years old, and I immediately picked up a deck and started.

For the first two years of cardistry I practiced moves that I would see off instagram and youtube. I started creating moves because I was tired of doing other cardist's cuts. I still haven't came up with a cut I would call "finished".

Closer to modern day, I don't do as much cardistry or post as much as I did. I delete a lot of what I post because they miss a certain flare i'm trying to get. Today I focus more on what I want to do as a carrier (movie director). Some of my favorite movies are "La La Land", "Goodfellas", "The Jazz Singer", and "The Hateful Eight".

1. If you'd be on your death bed, what would be your last cardistry words or last flourish to perform?

If I was on my death bed and had to do a last flourish, I would choose "Promelo", because its what got me into cardistry and what would take me out.

2. How many cards do you think you've dropped up until now? Who would you put at the top of the billboard?

Giving the fact i've been doing this for about 5 years, I would say i've dropped about 50,000 cards. Its hard to put someone on top in the cardistry community, but my favorite cardist is Noel, he is constantly doing stuff I didn't think could happen and has the most original material in my opinion. My favorite, more underground cardist, is Carter MacDiarmid, his moves have a ton of movement and look so different than other.

3. If cardistry would be a movie, who would be the villain and what would be the action?

This is my kinda question. I can see a cardistry movie being about a man attempting to spy to steal moves to post first. Like a "Cape Fear" kinda of plot. The villain trying to listen in and steal what could be the next move of the year.

4. Tell us the story behind the move you're about to teach.

This move was just me trying to make a different square display that happens quick. It took me a while to find a closer and I still don't know if it is the right one. Im curious to see who adds what to the move, and I think a lot of cool stuff can come from it.







#### CARD THROUGH PAPERBAG FERMANDO NADAL

l. Get a paperbag. It's pretty important to have this. One might say it's essential, but you... you magicians can surely find a way to execute this without it as well.

2. Acquire a deck of cards. This detail might be essential too. From the accompanying images, one might agree, but from the accompanying images one might also say one needs a laptop, which is FALSE.

3. Find a spectator. Without one, it's like favoring masturbation over sex. You get the analogy.

4. Take a short look at the pictures on the left. I hope you understand what you have to do. I expect my readers to be able to see.

5. Card controlled to the top, pinky finger pulls on the top card as you place the deck inside of the paperbag. Card is slid down to the bottom bent side.

6. To make that card MELT through the paperbag, Fernando here tells us we should blow down towards the card. This will make the card turn around and fall into the awaiting hand.

\* Another idea is to have the spectator hold the bag (he won't be able to see the card anyway). You can then take a knife, stab the card and paperbag then pull back the knife to reveal the MIRACLE.

#### CARDISTRY SKETCH #5FF22

Props:

A cardist. Someone who's "controlling" the cardist. An A4 paper. Pen.

Preparation:

Draw on the A4 paper an UP, DOWN, LEFT and RIGHT arrow.

Video:

One person is seated in front of the A4 paper. This is presented to be able to manipulate the cardist. Obviously, you can present this in a more cinematic way, with an unboxing of the "toy", maybe even put the cardist in a gigantic box.

Proceed to "play" with the Cardist. By "pushing" the arrows you control the way he moves, cuts, fans the deck.

Extra Controls:

You can have more controls than just arrows on the paper. Like fanning, cutting, splitting, throwing, etc.

I'm not very good at cardistry, but I think what I've done proves that you don't have to be good at something to love it and make a difference. Outside of cardistry, fine art is a big part of my life and I'm interested in combining the two in new and interesting ways.

1. Why did you make a Cardistry Magazine? Talk a bit about your vision for this magazine and cardistry in general.



Before PaperCuts, there wasn't a printed cardistry magazine. It might not seem a big thing, but I thing there's an enormous difference between reading something online and reading it in print. I believe the experience is much richer when you can hold something in your hands or see it with your own eyes, rather than through a computer screen.

In terms of my vision, I'd like to see PaperCuts stocked in ordinary bookshops and magazine shops. I also want to make sure that with every issue, we innovate. ISS3 contains QR code links to videos throughout the magazine, giving the reader a broader understanding of the subject. I'd like to see more and more technology interwoven with the magazine. B. If your magazine would be a weapon of mass destruction, how would it affect its victims?

Upon reading the magazine, everybody would be inspired to take up cardistry and explore playing cards. As a result, nobody would do any work and the world would grind to a halt, the only movement being cards shuffled by billions across the planet.

C. What other art-forms do you see cardistry merging and playing along with?

As I mentioned earlier, I think fine art is ripe for integration with cardistry. I see cardistry itself as an art, so with respect to that, I'd love to see cardistry displayed in new ways other than video. I'm hoping that, in the future, PaperCuts will be able to host a multimedia exhibition of cardistry.

Posting when you haven't practiced enough, chatting shit about other people's cardistry instead of constructive criticism, buying too many cards, not buying enough cards, worrying about how good other people are instead of focusing on yourself, putting other work above cardistry, not actually using expensive cards.

Well, **Cardistry High** with Zach and Noel was pretty lit. The Anyone Worldwide team is incredible. I think if Tobias and Tomoya collabed, that would be sick.

ldea:

A normal person walks in front of different mirrors displayed in a shop, only to discover his reflection in each mirror holding and manipulating different objects . In one mirror holding a pen and we see him spinning it. Juggling balls in another and he starts playing with them.

The sequence shows both the person in reality and the one in the mirror. Better to show snippets of both and, through cinema, to make it clear that it is the mirror we are watching when the person is performing with the objects.

Then you get to the cardistry mirror.

You can make this very funny by showing the person from the mirror first and then showing how the one from reality is actually moving his silly hands.

Or you can take this down the serious road and when we see the person in reality, he really is performing cardistry moves but without any deck in his hand.

Ending:

The shop owner asks the client if he wants to buy a mirror. The character looks at the owner, then back at the mirror. The camera zooms inside the mirror and fades to black.

During the end credits (which roll down on the right) we see the individual sitting on a chair and practicing in front of the mirror, but he got cards in his hands. The person in the reflection of the mirror is the one with no cards.

Like this, the watcher has been transported on the other side of the mirror by the end of the video.

Note:

Obviously, you can modify this idea however you want. Just make it look cool and have fun doing it!
